

UC/CSU

- Requirements exceed OHS graduation requirements
- Must meet A-G requirements
- Grades of C or better
- SAT/ACT prior to Nov/Dec (Reporting test scores is not required. SAT and ACT scores will not be
 used for determining who gets admitted into the UC/CSU. If you are accepted to a CSU, the
 campus will use official test scores for placement into mathematics and English courses. For the
 UC, they may be used as an alternative method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility
 or for course placement after you enroll.)
- UC requires Personal Insight Questions
- UC and CSU application deadlines are November 30th

UC/CSU A-G Requirements

A: History/Social Science- 2 yrs., including 1 yr of World History and U.S. History

B: English- 4 yrs. of college-preparatory English

C: Mathematics - 3 yrs. of college-preparatory mathematics (Math I, II & III or Math A, B, C & D)

D: Laboratory Science - 2 yrs. of laboratory science (Biology, Chemistry and/or Physics)

E: Language other than English 2 yrs. of the same language other than English

F: Visual and Performing Arts- 1 yr. from the approved A-G list

G:College-preparatory Elective- 1 yr. chosen from the A-F courses beyond those used to satisfy the requirements above, or courses that have been approved solely in the elective area.

SAT Testing Information

Sending SAT scores to UC/CSU (optional, not used for admission)

- UC: Send scores to one school
- CSU: Use Cal State Apply code 3594

*Fee waivers available: see your counselor

ACT Testing Information

Sending ACT scores to UC/CSU (optional, not used for admission)

- UC: Send scores to one school
- CSU: Use ACT Score Manager

*Fee waivers available: see your counselor

September-November

- Visit college (virtually) and apply- Make sure to keep track of application deadlines.
- Take ACT/SAT/Subject test (see if colleges are requiring and sign up early)
- Apply for scholarships

December-February

- FAFSA
- CSS Profile
- Continue to apply for outside scholarships

March-April

- Review Financial Aid package
- Pay required housing deposit

May

- Inform the college that you plan to attend
- Pay deposit by due date

The Reality of College Costs

Tuition and Fees

- University of CA: On campus: \$38,504, off campus \$35,604
- CA State University (Stanislaus): On campus: \$23,643 off campus \$30,099, with parents \$21,462
- Private College (UOP): \$72,374 (on-campus)
- Community College: \$3,410 (tuition & fees, transportation, books and supplies)

At public universities, 83% of students receive some type of financial aid.

At private universities, 89% of students receive some type of financial aid.

Financial Aid

<u>FAFSA</u> (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

- Need Based vs Merit Based
- Grants & Scholarships- financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid (unless, for example, you withdraw from school and owe a refund)
- Loans- borrowed money for college or career school; you must repay your loans, with interest
 - The federal government pays the interest for Direct Subsidized Loans while the student is in college or while the loan is in deferment. Interest begins accruing for Direct Unsubsidized Loans as soon as the loan is taken out.
- Work-Study- a work program through which you earn to help you pay for school
 - FAFSA4caster estimates how much aid you might receive from the US Dept of Education.

Myths About Financial Aid

- "...my parents make too much money, so I won't qualify for aid."
- "...only students with good grades get financial aid."
- "...the form is too hard to fill out."

Middle Class Scholarship

- Complete the 2024-25 FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application
- Be a CA resident attending a UC/CSU
- For undergraduates and students pursuing a teaching credential
- Students whose families have income and assets up to \$226,000 per year may be eligible for a scholarship of no less than 10% and no more than 40% of the mandatory systemwide tuition and fees at the UC and the CSU
- Middle Class Scholarship Info Link
- Due April 2, 2024

UC Blue & Gold

- Complete the 2024-25 FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application
- UC's Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan will ensure that you will not have to pay UC's systemwide tuition and fees out of your own pocket if you are a California resident whose total family income is less than \$80,000 a year and you qualify for financial aid.

California Dream Act

The California Dream (Development, Relief and Education for Alien Minors) is a package of CA state laws that allow children who were brought into the U.S. under the age of 16 without proper visas/immigration documentation who have attended school on a regular basis and otherwise meet in-state tuition and GPA requirements to apply for student financial aid benefits.

CA Dream Act Application

FAFSA/CADAA State Requirement

- California Education Code (CEC) 51225.7 requires a local educational agency to confirm each 12th grade pupil's completion and submission of a FAFSA or CADAA unless the pupil is determined to be exempt or an opt-out form is completed by the pupil who is a legally emancipated minor, a pupil who is 18 years or older, a legal guardian, or parent, or a local educational agency on a pupil's behalf.
- If you would like to opt-out completing the FAFSA or CADAA, here is the link to the <u>opt out</u> form.
- Forms are due by **November 30, 2023 to your counselor.**

CSS/Financial Aid Profile

- The <u>College Board's CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE</u> is an online application that collects information used by almost 400 colleges and scholarship programs to award financial aid from sources outside of the federal government.
 - Opens as early as October 1st
- Sending your PROFILE report to one college or scholarship program cost \$25. Additional reports are \$16 each. Fee waivers are available.
- Not all colleges and scholarship programs require the PROFILE.
